Wallasea Wetland bird monitoring - October-December 2007

This inter-tidal wetland, created on Wallasea Island by DEFRA, is designed to compensate for bird habitat losses elsewhere in SE England. The site is being surveyed for winter bird usage to monitor the success of the scheme. Six counts were carried out in winter 2006/07, with a further 12 planned (two/month) this winter. The counts are being carried out by *CJT Ecology* on behalf of DEFRA.

The following table summarises the results from the six counts carried Oct-Dec 2007 and compares them with the equivalent 2006 count. When comparing 2007 with 2006 it is clear that the majority of species have increased in number, particularly the longer beaked wading birds. There were some high total overall totals in 2006 but these were dominated by the relatively high numbers of both golden plover and lapwing.
